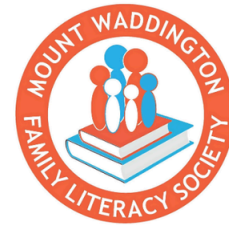

- There may be an opportunity for additional weekly hours for a candidate who has bookkeeping and payroll experience.

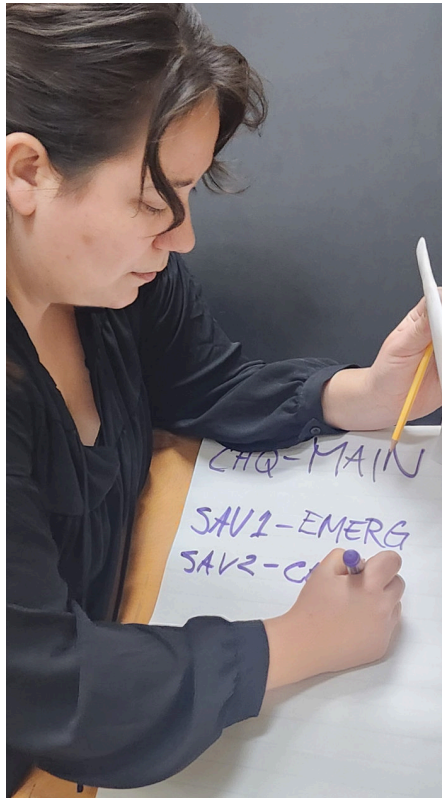

Ways to Save workshop: fun, food and practical learning



In December, MWFLS hosted a Money Matters: Ways to Save workshop at Sacred Wolf Friendship Centre. Led by former banker Rikki Clarke (current Child and Family Development Worker at Sacred Wolf), the session offered a welcoming space to talk about money in a practical, down-to-earth way, with good food and good conversation.

Participants explored simple, realistic ways to save money, sharing ideas and learning how even small changes can add up over time. Topics included ways to save for your child's education, how to save using a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA), shopping habits, comparison shopping and making smart buying decisions.

"The workshop sparked thoughtful discussion, questions, and moments of insight, reminding everyone that financial learning can be supportive, accessible, and even fun," said MWFLS adult literacy coordinator Jeanne James-Hory.

52% of adults may struggle with numeracy-based tasks like calculating interest, using graph info, or figuring out medicine dosage.

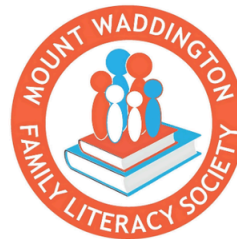
